Workshops in Turkey were structured in the light of several perspectives.

Project team presented the theoretical base of PROFILES ideas to us (teachers) and then they invited us to 'explore' how those ideas might be 'translated' into our classroom practice.

Project team invited us to collaborate in the PROFILES project by online mailing lists and individual contacts








The second workshop was a two-day collaborative meeting..

Throughout the second workshop, teachers were called to share the understanding about the project goals, such as inquiry based science education and education through science

In the first day, we were engaged in small group series of workshops.





Teachers should be supported with continuous reflection and feedback in order to feel self-confident to introduce new practices in their classrooms (Clark & Hollingsworth, 2002).











In the process we discussed about title and scenario writing, selecting a socioscientific issue, and developing and/or adapting activities for inquiry-based science learning.



In total, six modules were initiated by PROFILES teachers
